ABOUT OUR OFFICE

Accommodations: Students with disabilities may request accommodations, such as testing, notetaking, electronic text, housing, etc. from Accessibility Services. In order to receive accommodations, documentation of a disability is required and must support the student's need for accommodations. Students must take full responsibility for ongoing assistance.

To Get Started: Students should contact Accessibility Services to schedule a meeting, and if possible, send a copy of their most recent documentation ahead of time.

Progress Conferencing: Students with disabilities may also access transitional services, on a voluntary basis, for ongoing support and adjustment to the college experience. Students can meet with Accessibility Services staff on a regular basis throughout their first year.

ADDITIONAL RESOURCES

Academic Support: Students can access and request a variety of services through the Academic Success Center to assist them with organization, study skills, time management, and note taking strategies.

Subject Peer Tutoring: Tutoring for many 100 and some 200 level courses is offered at no charge to students.

Writing Support: The Writing Center offers tutoring throughout the semester, helping students with all aspects of the writing process.

Career Services: Offers students and alumni a wide variety of support and services with the goal of lifelong career satisfaction.

Counseling Services: Dedicated to providing confidential mental health counseling to help students work through and overcome obstacles that may be hindering their personal, social, and professional success.
